Minor course Oxford Tradition



This booklet contains extracts from student journals. Its purpose is to work both as an archive and to provide testimony to the students' divergent ways of understanding the complexity of the history of art. It contains stories written by the students after a visit to the Natural History Museum of the University of Oxford, doodled floral patterns drawn as part of a warm up activity and, most importantly, the students responses to Fernanda Eugenio's "Oracle city" ethnographic method of exploring cities. The reader will also find notes that the students took during a four week course of presentations concerning the methodologies that art historians have utilised in studying the iconography and iconology of such artworks as Pre-Raphaelite paintings. The booklet also contains documentation of an exercise carried out by the students in which they built an understanding of ancient art by attempting to reproduce it. In these pages you will also find their personal reflections and drawings occasioned by their visits to museums in addition to photos of them meeting museum staff such as Darren Mann from the Natural History Museum and Candela Yanez from the Ashmolean museum.




